

EARTH DAY 2021

Earth Day is just around the corner, on April 22! Did you know that the first Earth Day was organized in 1970? Instigated by a US senator and taken up by 22 million Americans, it marked the beginning of legislation and regulations that forced us to clean up industry and municipalities to improve air and water quality. Prior to 1970, there were no regulations telling anyone what to put into the air or the water.

We've come a long way and today the air we breathe and the rivers and lakes we recreate in and around are much healthier than prior to 1970. Unfortunately, we are not done. This last generation tackled much needed local pollution. Today's generation is presented with the challenge of tackling global pollution in air, water, and soil, and a changing climate.
