- Samples should be brought in glass containers with the name of the water system clearly identified and delivered to Robin Matthews-Barnes at the registration desk by 5 pm on Wednesday. Please deliver at least 1/2 gallon of water total (can be in multiple containers).
- Samples will be served at room temperature to help the judges better assess each sample.
- The official judging panel will be a mix of people in attendance at the conference.
- Samples will be judged on a 10-point scale from Good (1) to Best (10).
- Scores will be tabulated and the winner will be announced immediately following the contest. The winning sample will be entered in the national contest at ACE in June in Toronto, Canada. Either you or a section representative will need to be present for the national competition--in the event your system wins and you cannot make it to the national competition—please see John Alston. AWWA's national competition requires that participants have had no violations during the calendar year prior to the competition.

Montana Water Environment Association

The Montana Water Environment Association was formed in 1944 as the Montana Pollution Control Association. It was associated at that time with the Federation of Sewage Works Association, which soon became the Water Pollution Control Federation (WPCF). When the WPCF changed its name to Water Environment Federation, the Montana section changed its name to Montana Water Environment Association to reflect that continued partnership.

The Association has approximately 123 members scattered across the state, and the membership includes operators, consulting engineers and local, state and federal water officials.

MWEA offers public education to adults and children in the community through such training events as Water Festivals and Infrastructure Financing Conferences. In addition, the Association conducts emergency response training events in several of Montana's largest communities.

MWEA Welcomes Stephen Sanders ~ 2022-2023 WEF Trustee



Stephen Sanders is a 2022-23 member of the WEF Board of Trustees and the director and head trainer of the Environmental Training Center at SUNY-Morrisville College in New York. The center provides precertification training for wastewater and drinking water operators, as well as for New York State Department of Conservation regulators. He has been training operators for more than 10 years and has grown the program to the largest of its kind in New York state. He is a dedicated water professional, certified as a licensed wastewater and drinking water operator and certified instructor for New York state. He has more than 20 years of experience in the field from the private, public and not-for-profit sectors.

Stephen has served on the initial WEF diversity, equity and inclusion task force and subsequent committee, as well as the WEFTEC Advisory Board. He helped establish his member association's (the New York Water Environment Association) DE&I committee and served as its first chairperson. He also serves on New York state's Operator Certification

Governance Council, New York Section AWWA Board of Governors, and as the chair for NYSAWWA Operators committee.



MWEA AWARDS

Each year MWEA presents a national WEF award and MWEA awards. This year MWEA will present the WEF George W. Burke, Jr. Safety Award and the MWEA Small Systems and Operator of the Year Awards. Other awards which are given on a rotating schedule include the WEF Arthur Sidney Bedell and William D. Hatfield Awards and the MWEA Beneficial Reuse Awards.

WEF George W. Burke, Jr. Safety Award—The award recognizes a municipal or industrial wastewater facility for establishing and maintaining an active and effective safety program. This award was established in 1982 in honor of **George W. Burke, Jr.**, for his many years of service to both the water environment field and WEF as staff manager of technical services. Mr. Burke was instrumental in developing WEF's annual safety survey and assisting in the production of several safety training aids and promotional packets. MSAWWA/MWEA Donald G. Willems Scholarship


